Diane Ceo-DiFrancesco PhD is a Professor of Spanish and world language pedagogy at Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio. At Xavier she has served as Faculty Director of both the Center for Teaching Excellence and the Eigel Center for Community-Engaged Learning, and as interim Associate Provost. Diane instructs courses in Spanish language, linguistics and pedagogy.

Dedicated to fostering students' language proficiency and developing their intercultural competencies, Diane integrates community-engaged learning, virtual exchange and collaborative online international learning (COIL) into the courses that she teaches. She serves on the coordination team of the AUSJAL Virtual Dual Immersion Program which has reached over 40,000 students since 2007.

Diane has coordinated study abroad programs in Peru, Guatemala, Mexico, Costa Rica and Spain and directed a Fulbright-Hays Group Project in Colombia for Spanish teachers in June, 2022. Diane delivers webinars and training workshops internationally on COIL and virtual exchange pedagogy, and was awarded the Ohio Foreign Language Association Technology award in 2017. She has published articles in *Hispania*, *Foreign Language Annals*, *The Language Educator*, *Internet Journal of Allied Health Sciences*, *Journal of Community Engagement and Higher Education*, and *Journal of Higher Education Theory and Practice*. Diane and her co-authors have recently published two Spanish language textbooks entitled *Experiencias*, incorporating social justice themes with an intentional learner-centered approach. Her research interests include intercultural communicative competence, telecollaborative/virtual exchange pedagogy, COIL, second language acquisition, world language pedagogy, and immersion.
